Please take the time to respond to the survey emailed out in recent weeks. The closing date for the survey is Friday this week.


Primary Years Swimming

Out of Hours School Care Sub-Group - seeing people to be involved



Children's University - a fabulous new program available to a small group of students from Years 4 & 5 at Alawa

10 students will be provided the opportunity to participate in an exciting program: 'Children's University Australia' [CUA].

Children's University Australia aims to provide high-quality 'learning activities for children aged between 7 and 14 years, engaging the broader community as learning partners. An important principle of CUA is that participation is voluntary – children can choose their learning activities. Activities *must* occur outside the regular school day during lunch, after school, on weekends, and holidays. CDU also offers free activities for students and caregivers on Saturdays, during school holidays, and through school excursions.

Students enrolled in Charles Darwin Children's University will be issued a 'Passport to Learning,' which records their learning journey. Each time they participate in a Children's University Learning Activity, they will receive a 'stamp' in their 'Passport to Learning.' After 30 hours (or more) of learning, the children are rewarded for their participation with certificates at a graduation ceremony held at Charles Darwin University in November.

More information to come at Assembly and Muster! Stay tuned... We will also hold a 'Parent Introductory' night once our 10 applicants have been selected!




House points

In the lead for the Term is Goyder with 12149!




Class Points


The class with the most points in Week 4 of Term 1 was....Transition McGrath with 132 points!!!

The class with the highest attendance for Week 4: 1 Thorne/Baines with 97.78%!!! Amazing job!!!




Lates














t has been a very wet week at Preschool and our
