

In Week 10 of Term 2 Finnis was ahead with 7150 points! In the lead for Term 2 was Goyder with 60098 points!




Class Points


The class with the most points in Week 10 of Term 2 was....Transition Hughes with 130 points!!!


Lates




Recycling

Our recycling bags are up and ready for deposits in their usual location in the back car park hanging on the fence.


Each bag represents a house and all items will be recorded as a point for your house. Items can be delivered during school hours and placed directly into the bags.

Planning has commenced and the initial camp note will be sent home in the first week of Term 3. Please be aware that there are attendance and behaviour



A gift from Amelie and Eleanor


Amelie and Eleanor went on a beautiful adventure exploring England. They saw amazing things, learnt about the country and tasted delicious food.


