Assistant Principal Update

Welcome to week 2,

As you are aware Sandy and I have been spending time in the classes delivering our **PEP talks**. Just like in the primary talks we also reflected on events and achievements from last term such as the great feedback our school had from the review. The students learnt that just like students have goals for their learning, so do teachers, and we want this school to be the best it can be. You may have noticed the badges the students were wearing when they came



home, which has a visual of the program called the Zones of Regulation. Please take the time to chat with your children about our key messages from our PEP talks.

In week 1 and 2 our students from years Transition to Year 6 participated in **Progressive Achievement Tests: (PAT).** These assessments are a mandated assessment by the NT Education Department. The purpose of PAT is to provide student achievement and growth data in Maths and Reading at a student, class, school and system level. This information is used by our teachers to determine achievement levels as well as each child's next steps for learning. Tests use a personalised pathway to determine your child's ability in Reading and Maths. The Adaptive test accurately assesses a student during the test by continuously adapting the questions to fit their overall level of achievement. If a student answers a question correctly, they receive a harder one; if they answer incorrectly, they get an easier one.

I continue to carry out interviews for new Preschool families for next year. We currently have spaces in the Preschool and are open to enrolments out of zone. Our Playgroup sessions also continue to be held in the Preschool. If your child is beginning next year, please join us each Friday at 9:30 where your child can make new friends and become familiar with the Preschool environment.

Playgroup


Welcome back everyone. Playgroup is back on this Friday 20th October .


In Week 1 of Term 4 Goyder was ahead with 2671 points! In the lead for the Year to date is Goyder with 94511 points!






Lates

Over the holidays sadly the black rabbit, Oreo, died of old age. We have still got Duke. We hatched Muscovy Ducklings and Mixed Breed Chicks. You can visit the farm and buy one for \$15.

First week back for Term 4 has been an amazing week in Year 2. We

had the multi-disciplinary Larrakia Artist, Nadine Lee, visit us and share her amazing skills and First Nations knowledge.

We were fortunate enough to learn how to harvest bark from the Farms Native Hibiscus [*Hibiscus tiliaceus*] that we will weave into bracelets over the next few weeks.

After the lesson we shared in some bush tucker that Nadine prepared earlier including a Magpie goose stew and some bush medicine [Morinda citrifolia] drink.

The lesson focus was based around changing materials in Science, and what a privilege to have such an engaging and knowledgeable guest to help us learn on the Farm. This was funded through the Federal Government Wellbeing Grant.

2023 School Review Recommendations and the next steps: Your invitation to provide input and feedback

As we shared a few week ago we recently went through an external school review s all schools in the NT do each 4 years. From that review we now have 2 clear recommendations which will form the basis of our new 4 year Explicit Improvement Agenda.

Recommendations

Enhance the teaching and learning capabilities and expertise in the school through:

- ⇒ further development and embedding of evidence-informed, effective teaching strategies during explicit and guided instruction to promote deep learning
- ⇒ further refine pedagogical practices to maximise the impact on learning for all students across all learning areas
- \Rightarrow collaboratively building an agreed understanding of differentiated teaching and learning
- ⇒ providing explicit extension opportunities to progressively build students' conceptual understandings, effective questioning and critical thinking skills, with emphasis on challenging highly capable students
- \Rightarrow encouraging more innovative and creative practices by further development of inquiry learning.

Identify, develop and implement an evidence-informed, comprehensive and consistent approach to literacy instruction that incorporates and values current models and strategies, and includes:

- \Rightarrow an in-depth understanding of how students learn complex literacy skills
- ⇒ professional learning processes for staff to become experts in curriculum design and delivery
- \Rightarrow a collaboratively developed model for instruction
- \Rightarrow strategies to differentiate for and engage all learners
- \Rightarrow systems to monitor and evaluate practice.

We have started unpacking these as a staff as a focus at our professional learning day Monday this week and will share the high level goals being formulated with School Council on Monday 23rd October.

Are you eligible for FREE INTERNET?

The Australian Government has established the School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI) to provide free home internet for 12 months for up to 30,000 families with school aged children that do not currently have a National Broadband Network (NBN) connection at home.

The Department of Education is supporting the Australian Government's SSBI by becoming a nominating organisation to help identify eligible families within the Northern Territory (NT). To be eligible families must:

- have a child living at home that is enrolled in an Australian school in 2023
- not have an active NBN internet service at home. Having a mobile internet service does not affect eligibility
- live in a premises that can access the NBN via a standard connection. This will be validated by NBN Co.

There are many ways families can nominate for the SSBI.

- Receive/request a nomination form from your child's school.
- Access the nomination form online at https://forms.office.com/r/sllsrGb74BP or scan the QR code with your phone's camera and click on the link that appears.

Request a nomination form by emailing <u>digitalandda-</u> <u>ta.doe@education.nt.gov.au</u> or calling 8972 5344.

Nomination forms need to be returned to schools or completed online as soon as possible so that vouchers can be delivered and <u>activated before 30 April 2024</u>. For more information on SSBI please visit <u>www.infrastructure.gov.au/SSBI</u>

Hot tips

About anxiety

Anxiety and mental health in children

Fearful and anxious behaviour is common in children. Most children learn to cope with a range of normal fears and worries. However, extra help may be needed when:

- children feel anxious more than other children of their age and level
- anxiety stops them participating in activities at school or socially
- anxiety interferes with their ability to do things that other children their age do easily
- the fears and worries seem out of proportion to the issues in their life.

When children become anxious more easily, more often and more intensely than other children, they may be diagnosed with an anxiety disorder. The most common anxiety disorders in children of primary school age are Phobias, Generalised Anxiety Disorder and Separation Anxiety. Research estimates that between approximately two and nine per cent of children and adolescents in Australia have anxiety disorders.

How you can help

Parents and other adults can help by supporting children to be brave. In order to be brave children need to have skills for understanding and managing their feelings. They need to learn about helpful thinking that they can use to encourage themselves to have a go, and they need to gradually build up their confidence by taking on small challenges.
