Principal Update

Dear families,

We had a special guest visitor to our school last Thursday. Education Minister, Eva Lawler and local MLA, Joel Bowden paid a visit to the school. Upon arrival our guests were greeted and presented with flowers and farm produce by our School Captains and

Vice School Captains. The minster spent some time meeting and talking to the leadership team about our school improvement agenda and future projects. I spoke about the councils plans to build a toilet facility to our existing library and how this



would improve accessibility to our library during and after school hours especially since we often rent out the space to other businesses. The Minister was very interested and asked for plans and submissions to be passed on. I will keep you posted if there are any updates. I also spoke about the need for Primary schools to have greater access to support services such as play therapist and counsellors for students with social and emotional needs.

Our student leadership then took the Minister on a tour of the school showcasing the Mindfulness Room, farm, kitchen, café and library. She was very impressed and said Alawa was an outstanding school!

Over the last couple of weeks, a group of students from Year 5 and 6 attended the Media Enrichment Program at Dripstone Middle School. The project focuses on using Green Screen technology to create movies. Our students have been working on making a short movie about themselves using this technology. This week, we also had a group of 8 students attend the Maths Enrichment Program at Dripstone Middle School. Transition programs such as these are such a valuable experience for the students.







In Week 3 of Term 2 Manton was ahead with 2732 points! In the lead for the Term is Goyder with 41322 points!






Class Points




Lates

Honour Awards—To be presented Friday 12th May






