Class Structures and Student placements for 2024

As advised previously we are currently finalising our class structures for 2024— it currently looks like we will have:

2 x Preschool groups 1 x Transition group 1 x Transition / Year 1 group

2 x Year 1/2 classes1 x Year 2 class1 x Year 3 class1 x Year 3/4 class2 x Year 4/5 classes3 x Year 5/6 classes.

Students will be allocated a class which will be proposed and not finalised until the week prior to school starting in 2024. Just so all are aware, the process is:

- 1. The number of classes and composition of year levels across the school is determined based on numbers of students expected at each year level.
- 2. Teachers are then assigned to classes based upon teacher requests, the best match to skill sets & knowledge and of the needs of our students.
- 3. Children are allocated to classes based upon their friendship requests and the optimum aim to balance classes with a spread of ability and gender.






In Week 6 of Term 4 Goyder was ahead with 4972 points! In the lead for the Year to date is Goyder with 113 061 points!






Class Points

The winning class for Weeks 4-6 is...Transition Hughes with 417 points!!! Keep it up!!!




Lates

For Week 6 it was fabulouso to see NO lates at all for Transition McGrath, 4/5 Daniels and 5/6


In the lead for Term 4 we have... 5/6 Henderson with 1 late!!!

This means that over the next couple of months we are going to see friends, family and neighbours packing up their lives and moving on to their next location. As well as new families moving to Darwin. Moving is a major life change. It is an event filled with a variety of emotions. A move of choice may be viewed as a positive opportunity associated with feelings of excitement and anticipation. In contrast, a move without choice, may be associated with feelings of fear, anxiety, and sadness. Each family member may experience different emotions at different times. However, if relocation is approached with an optimistic attitude, it can promote family growth and involvement.

The relationship of the parents forms the foundation for a healthy family. The strength of this foundation is the key to family stability. During times of relocation children benefit from the security of their parents' love and support.

Suggestions for helping couples through the relocation process [whether it is a Defence related move or not]:

- Focus on yourself. If you take care of your physical and emotional needs, you will be better prepared to help your family.
- Express and share your feelings, emotions, and expectations with your partner
- Recognise that your family may experience a sense of loss as a result of a move. It takes time to work through this loss.
- After the move, become involved in familiar activities
- Maintain contacts with friends and relatives
- Schedule time alone as a couple

Are you eligible for FREE INTERNET?

The Australian Government has established the School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI) to provide free home internet for 12 months for up to 30,000 families with school aged children that do not currently have a National Broadband Network (NBN) connection at home.

The Department of Education is supporting the Australian Government's SSBI by becoming a nominating organisation to help identify eligible families within the Northern Territory (NT). To be eligible families must:

- have a child living at home that is enrolled in an Australian school in 2023
- not have an active NBN internet service at home. Having a mobile internet service does not affect eligibility
- live in a premises that can access the NBN via a standard connection. This will be validated by NBN Co.

There are many ways families can nominate for the SSBI.

- Receive/request a nomination form from your child's school.
- Access the nomination form online at https://forms.office.com/r/sLSrGb74BP or scan the QR code with your phone's camera and click on the link that appears.

Request a nomination form by emailing digitalanddata.doe@education.nt.gov.au or calling 8972 5344.

Nomination forms need to be returned to schools or completed online as soon as possible so that vouchers can be delivered and <u>activated before 30 April 2024</u>. For more information on SSBI please visit <u>www.infrastructure.gov.au/SSBI</u>
