The swimming lessons are fun and are teaching us all about being safe in the water. The children have been great listeners and remembering all the safety rules for in and around the pool.








In Week 7 of Term 4 Finnis was ahead with 4795 points! In the lead for the Year to date is Goyder with 116 505 points!






#### Lates




## Recycling

The Royal Life Saving instructors have given positive feedback to our student's ability to listen and demonstrate swimming skills to the best of their ability. Students learnt the Aqua Code and what to do in an Emergency when three whistles are blown at the pool or Waterpark. Lightening and storms





within a close proximity to water was an important conversation had during our lessons.

With the wet season upon us please be vigilant when in and around water. Adult supervision is paramount for all children.














# Are you eligible for FREE INTERNET?

The Australian Government has established the School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI) to provide free home internet for 12 months for up to 30,000 families with school aged children that do not currently have a National Broadband Network (NBN) connection at home. The Department of Education is supporting the Australian Government's SSBI by becoming a nominating organisation to help identify eligible families within the Northern Territory (NT).

To be eligible families must:

- have a child living at home that is enrolled in an Australian school in 2023
- not have an active NBN internet service at home. Having a mobile internet service does not affect eligibility
- live in a premises that can access the NBN via a standard connection. This will be validated by NBN Co.

There are many ways families can nominate for the SSBI.

- Receive/request a nomination form from your child's school.
- Access the nomination form online at <a href="https://forms.office.com/r/sLSrGb74BP">https://forms.office.com/r/sLSrGb74BP</a> or scan the QR code with your phone's camera and click on the link that appears.
