
Principal's Message



In our recent PIVOT survey where students provide feedback for their teachers in Years 3-6 we had 45 / 185 responses indicate students felt their teachers did not challenge them to think deeply - so I have started a new weekly challenge as I have introduced the Thunk concept during Pep Talks in Years 3-6.

Thunk of the Week

Starting this Monday each week I am inviting students to reflect and think deeply to respond to a question - known as a Thunk! The weekly challenge will be displayed on the student noticeboard outside the Hub from Monday morning and also be in the newsletter each Wednesday. Students are invited to respond via email or come to the front at Muster after lunch on a Thursday to share their responses. Upto 50 house points can be earned for the response - reflecting their deep thinking.



This week we have Amelie Dennis receiving an Honour Distinction!





HOUSE POINTS

In Week I of Term 2 Finnis was ahead with 5365 points! In the lead for the Year to date is Finnis with 41909 points!






CLASS POINTS

The class with the most points in Week I of Term 2 was.... 2 Snow with 151 points!!!




ATTENDANCE




LATES


RECYCLING
